HELAINÉ LEGGAT: This is the first state that's actually come up with it's own Cyber Security Strategy.

GAVIN JENNINGS MLC: The Cyber Security Strategy - 23 actions over three years. We will not be complacent in relation to emerging risks, emerging opportunities.

BRUCE DAWSON: Ultimately, what we're doing is developing cyber security behaviours that help keep ourselves and the public safe.

JACQUIE DELORD: This strategy's really helpful for us, in terms of giving us a framework to work within, and also setting up partnerships.

HELAINÉ LEGGAT: At the moment, we're involved in a project mapping out all of the cyber security infrastructure, skill shortages and what's required in terms of education and so on.

So, everything that we can learn from being here, we can feed back to members.

STEVE HODGKINSON: It's very heartening for us to see that there is a whole-of-government attention to this, because we are just one department in a complex and large state government.

TONY BATES: We had a team of people from the major banks, from Prime Minister and Cabinet, from Australian Signals Directorate, so it's really good that we've been able to get that public sector, private sector and state, federal cooperation.

Hopefully that puts us in a great spot to keep leading the nation.

ROB FITZPATRICK: It's about, as the Minister talked about, resilience and how we respond.

This is a journey, not a short-term project.

HELAINÉ LEGGAT: We will watch how it unfolds, how it rolls out, and we hope to be involved and to encourage our members to be involved, and to try and get Victoria right up there at the top of the cyber strategy.
